PFC GARFIELD M. LANGHORN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Annual \$1,000 scholarship and numerous \$100 scholarships will be awarded to descendants of Vietnam Veterans and/or Vietnam Era Veterans

Garfield was a true American hero who sacrificed his life by protecting wounded platoon from enemy attack by throwing himself on a live grenade on January 15, 1969 in Pleiku Province, Vietnam.

Garfield was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor posthumously on April 7 1970 by President Richard M. Nixon to Mr. and Mrs. Garfield M. Langhorn Sr. and sibblings at the White House.

Please submit an essay of 250 words with the students name and contact information on the topic "Why I am proud of Garfield M. Langhorn and to be an American" no later than December 31, 2023.

Awards will be announced the week of January 15, 2024.

Eligibility:

- The applicant must be a descendent of a Vietnam Veteran or Vietnam Era Veteran.
- A Vietnam Veteran or Vietnam Era Veteran who has no descendants is authorized to sponsor one family member as an applicant
- The applicant must be enrolled in an accredited college, university or trade school

Washington, D.C. – As the nation begins the yearlong recognition of the 50th anniversary of the close of the Vietnam War, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF) has announced *The Wall That Heals* national tour schedule for 2023. *The Wall That Heals* exhibit includes a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center. The 28th season of *The Wall That Heals* will begin on March 16th, 2023, in San Luis Obispo, California and visit 32 communities during the year. The traveling exhibit honors the more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed Forces in the Vietnam War and it bears the names of the 58,281 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Thank you for your interest in volunteering at the VAMC Northport. All Volunteer Opportunities are Monday – Friday.

The following are areas of placement where we need assistance at this time:

<u>Ambulatory Surgery Unit (ASU)</u> – Check patients in and assist families with questions. Looking for early birds 7:30/8am – noon or later.

<u>Red Coat Ambassador Program</u> – Meet and greet in building 200 at front desk – Patient assistance/directions. Schedule is currently being filled. You must commit to a day/time to fill schedule.

Escort - Wheelchair assistance - Flexible hours between 7:30am - 4:00pm.

<u>Units 33/34</u> – Checking in visitors – Later in the day 2pm – 5pm.

<u>Friendly Companion Program</u> – Visit a patient (or more) on a regular basis. You will be matched with a patient through Social Work Service – minimum 1 hour per week, 1 year commitment.

General Office Duties – Clerical, phones, filing, etc.

<u>Prosthetics Services</u> – Receive deliveries, package items, stock shelves, assisting with paperwork.

<u>DAV Call Center</u> – Schedule DAV Transportation for patient medical appointments.

<u>DAV Driver</u> – Transport patient to/from the VAMC Northport for medical appointments utilizing our DAV Vans.

Over the years, the veterans of this country, along with their families have protected us time and again so that we may live as free people in this country we love. The veterans alive today understand the sacrifices they have made – and they understand, honor, and respect the sacrifices of those that served before them. There, in Northport, at the Medical Center, exists a place of tranquility and safety for our veterans - and for all visitors – to reflect on these sacrifices and our nation's great history. In 2009, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Garden was constructed. Building upon this Memorial Garden and a stage and patio was added in 2011...and now it is time to add the third and final phase of this project:

Spanning from the American Revolution, to today's global War on Terror, the Wall will include twelve granite monuments that each depict a period of history in America

Veterans, their families and friends, and visitors of all ages will be able to walk among the monuments and reflect on the history of this country and those that have served, sacrificed, and died for the protection of our freedom.

Imagine the veterans visiting, healing, and living at the Medical Center having a place to sit and quietly reflect on what they and those before them have achieved. Imagine the therapeutic effects of sharing these reflections with their fellow service members, or their children and grandchildren. The Wall of Wars will become a place to honor, remember, and educate. In time, we plan to add features such as audio narratives and smart phone applications to enhance the visitors experience and highlight the contributions of brave Americans.
